



Examples of HarborOne Foundation Grants by Focus Area

Education:

- **Attleboro YMCA** received a grant to support the addition of a robust STEM program to the organization's "Schools Out" curriculum serving over 50 low income youth and their families
- **Bridgewater State University Foundation** received a grant to support the participation of 110 Brockton middle and high school students in a newly enhanced version of the Bridge Partnership (BP)
- **Brockton Boys & Girls Club** received a grant to support teen educational programs including the Pinnacle leadership program and Keystone Club, which focuses on college readiness and leadership development
- **Coaching 4 Change** received a grant to support the expanded services to the Gateway City of Taunton. Funds will be utilized to recruit, train and deploy college and high school students to provide integrated interventions through intensive tutoring and mentoring of low-income students who are performing below grade level in core academic subjects
- **Father Bill's and MainSpring** received a grant to help 50 homeless individuals' efforts to attain job skills, complete on-the-job-training and build towards stable employment and housing
- **The Literacy Center** received a grant to support individuals and families seeking to acquire the skills needed to attain personal and employment goals
- **Old Colony YMCA** received a grant to support a multi-layered response to eradicate the academic achievement gap for both children and their families
- **School on Wheels MA (SOWMA)** received a grant to support the expansion of the "Educating Children and Youth Impacted by Homelessness" program in Attleboro which provides one-on-one tutoring/mentoring and academic support services to 20 students impacted by homelessness
- **South Shore Stars** received a grant to help expand the hours a Family Partner staff member devotes to providing information, referral, advocacy and coaching to parents with a goal of improving financial stability
- **Quincy Community Action (QCAP)** received a grant to support QCAP's regionally unique, Financial REACH Center which provides financial capability services for low-income residents including financial coaching, credit repair, debt reduction, free tax preparation and access to education and employment services, including job placement

Housing:

- **Father Bill's & MainSpring** received a grant to support Montello Welcome Home II, a new supportive housing development that will house 23 homeless individuals
- **Habitat for Humanity of Greater Plymouth** received a grant to support The Plymouth Veterans Build Project which will construct three affordable homes off Long Pond Road on land provided by the Town of Plymouth

- **Heidrea For Heroes** received a grant to support projects involving adaptive home renovations and repairs to enhance the safety of home-owning veterans, and financial assistance for veterans facing eviction from rental units
- **Housing Solutions for Southeastern MA** received a grant to provide high quality affordable housing for seniors in greater Brockton and Taunton
- **NeighborWorks Southern NG** received a grant to address housing needs and improved accessibility in the greater Manchester area
- **NeighborWorks, Southern MA** received a grant to support a Program Coordinator to work directly with low- to moderate-income individuals to help provide educational and financial assistance necessary to successfully purchase a first home
- **Old Colony Habitat for Humanity** received a grant to help construct a 3-bedroom home for a deserving family in the community of Mansfield
- **South Shore Habitat for Humanity** received a grant to help construct six low and moderate units for deserving families in the community of Duxbury

Basic Needs:

- **Community Servings** received a grant to help provide medically-tailored home-delivered meals, comprehensive client services, and nutrition education and counseling to 185 low-income primary clients, dependent children and caregivers living with devastating illnesses across Southeastern MA
- **Health Imperatives** received a grant to support increase access to health care and counseling through the Healthy Plymouth Project
- **New Hope** received a grant to provide emergency shelter and support services to 30 families and individuals fleeing violence in their home in Bristol and Norfolk Counties
- **Old Colony YMCA** received a grant to support the Family Stabilization program that provides wraparound services for families transitioning from homelessness to independent living
- **South Shore Community Action Council** received a grant to support the operation of the Food Resources Program which provides emergency food assistance to 16,200 food insecure residents of all ages living in 25 towns within Plymouth County
- **The Arc Of The South Shore** received a grant to support program access to low and moderate income families
